The Here for Herefordshire programme aims to get children and young people involved with fun, new activities. This summer activities include horse riding, pottery, cheerleading, drama workshops, multi-sports and so much more – the list is huge. There will also be a free healthy meal for children at each activity session. Some providers are able to offer provision for children with SEND or additional needs.

Did you know that Herefordshire libraries offer a home delivery service, aimed at people who are unable to visit the library in person? Everyone deserves the opportunity to experience the pleasure of reading, so if you struggle to get out and about, and you're a real book worm (or just want to try something new) this service could be for you.

The Library Home Delivery Service is a free facility to deliver up to 20 library items to Herefordshire residents every six weeks. There is a wide range of books on offer, with many available in large print, in alternative languages or as audio books on CD.

Available to both children and adults, who live at home or in residential care; Herefordshire's friendly Librarians have the expertise to ensure you can still enjoy what the library has to offer.
